Amiel Ungar's far-reaching journalism background includes Foreign Affairs columnist for the Hebrew-language Israeli daily Makor Rishon and Political Affairs columnist and member of the editorial board of the monthly Nekuda. Ungar is a long-time Contributing Editor for The Jerusalem Report, Columnist for Emunah Magazine and regularly publishes op-eds in The Jerusalem Post and Yediot Achronot.

From 1990-2006, Ungar worked at the College of Judea and Samaria. Prior to that, from 1978-1990, he was a professor and lecturer at Bar Ilan University.

Ungar has an extensive education in political science. He earned a B.A. from Yeshiva College and both an M.ph and Ph.D. from Columbia University, with all degrees centered in this field.

Ungar has previously served as the Chairman of the Governing Board of the northern Judean community Tekoa and representative to the Gush Etzion Regional Council. He is currently the Representative of Tekoa to the Council of Jewish Communities in Judea and Samaria.

He is married with five children and lives in Tekoa.
